## Missionary Moment for June

This month we will focus on VBS. VBS is a fun-filled program many churches offer, usually during the summer months, to connect with the children and their families in their communities. VBS is an outreach meant to bring in children who don't normally attend church and to teach them the gospel. VBS began in the 1890s. A New York doctor's wife wanted to find a way to keep children off the streets in the summertime, and so she rented a large beer hall in the East Side in order to conduct what she called "Everyday Bible School." Her idea expanded and eventually the New York City Baptist Mission Society established several of these Bible schools around the city. A man named Robert G. Boville, formerly of the Baptist Mission Society, was key in the program's expansion to other cities around the country. By 1907, he had established a national committee for Vacation Bible Schools. Churches generally run VBS for a week, and each program has its own theme that children can explore. A week of VBS usually includes games, snacks, crafts, skits, and, of course, Bible lessons. There is always a connection between God and the theme, allowing kids to discover God in a creative way.

## **VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL DEDICATION**

## **Note from the Past:**

On this Father's day, we celebrate one of the most vital relationships to the survival of humanity, and one of the most threatened in modern society.

This coming week, we continue our long tradition of Vacation Bible School. Here is a picture of VBS from the 1940s. Even after the new Sanctuary was built in 1960, VBS continued in the 'Old building', which was the 1893 Church building that is shown on the front cover of the bulletin.

According to Mary Nevius, the 'small' wing to the right was the original 1868 Church building, which was converted to Sunday School classrooms after completion of the 1893 building.

During Dr. John Pollard's service as pastor from 1890 to 1901, the church discussed the need for a new church structure as 'the first little building had weathered the storm for 22 years.' The wooden church building was erected in 1893. The structure cost \$3,000 to construct. This is often referred to as the "Old Building". During the all-day dedication service in late June 1893, a packed sanctuary full of members, friends, and sister churches raised the \$800 remaining to pay off the balance owed.

This frame building was outstanding with a steeple and bell and lovely windows. It had a beautiful stained glass window in the front and another over the pulpit. (This window is now in the front of the 1989 building.) The side windows were replaced later with stained glass panes. In 1935 two rooms were added to the 1893 building. These rooms were used for the Dorcas Class and the Ladies' Friendship Class.

Ms. Jane Cross recalled,

*"In the second church, water for the baptismal pool came from a well and was carried by buckets to fill the pool. In the winter, heated bricks warmed the water. In the summer months, to keep the well from going dry, baptisms were held at Thomas' Pond and Echo Lake."*

1896 saw an infant classroom built, as well as indoor and outdoor renovations. It is unclear what those renovations entailed. During Dr. Pollard's time, he led the Church to adopt a manual in 1900. This manual served to acquaint the members with the Church Covenant, history, and policies. With 139 members, the Church was growing, and the infant class included children up to eight years of age. Miss Maude Trevvett was the Sunday School teacher for the infant class.
