Missionary Moment for June

This month we will focus on VBS. VBS is a fun-filled program many churches offer, usually during the summer months, to connect with the children and their families in their communities. VBS is an outreach meant to bring in children who don’t normally attend church and to teach them the gospel. VBS began in the 1890s. A New York doctor’s wife wanted to find a way to keep children off the streets in the summertime, and so she rented a large beer hall in the East Side in order to conduct what she called “Everyday Bible School.” Her idea expanded and eventually the New York City Baptist Mission Society established several of these Bible schools around the city. A man named Robert G. Boville, formerly of the Baptist Mission Society, was key in the program’s expansion to other cities around the country. By

1907, he had established a national committee for Vacation Bible Schools. Churches generally run VBS for a week, and each program has its own theme that children can explore. A week of VBS usually includes games, snacks, crafts, skits, and, of course, Bible lessons. There is always a connection between God and the theme, allowing kids to discover God in a creative way.

NOTES FROM THE PAST

Reflections on Stained Glass Windows by Debbie Dean

Dear Church Family,

Whenever I look at the beautiful stained glass windows of our beloved church, I think of my most loved and missed Mom, for she was the one who took a few minutes to sketch off and color in (with oil pastels, chalk) the design for these very same windows we look at today.

My Mom, Gladys Boschen Dean, was a born artist and mostly self-taught. Church members would seek her out for art projects for special occasions as Christmas or Easter. Mom also taught Sunday School for awhile and my Dad, William Dean, served as a Sunday School teacher and deacon. Mom hand painted in oils the original Nativity Scene life size figures. I remember her using her bare fingertips to blend the oil paints onto the wooden carved figures! Recently I found photographs of other works she did for the Church, one of Jesus in the garden greeting Mary on Easter morn, dated April 1961.

Mom always, without fail, credited her artistic abilities to God, and in later years, told anyone who complimented her work, her talent was God's gift and a way to help her get through sad times and heartache, such as my Nanna's ordeal with Alzheimer's and my Dad's three year illness late in life which made him also bedridden.

Getting back to the stained glass window topic, I recall Mom at our long wooden kitchen table, very much like the one on the Walton's. Mom called it her "workshop," and this area of our kitchen her "studio"! (She'd laugh as she said that.) Anyhow, a church member dropped by to see if she could help with the new church's windows. At that very moment, Mom was working with the same pastel oil chalks that she would use for the sketch of the stained glass windows. She asked if those colors she had on hand would be alright, as those were all she had to work with at the time. Anyhow, she sketched and colored in a little design. These very same hues - pale brown, green, blue were chosen for the new glass panes.

Mom never thought herself an "artist", but she referred to her paint brush as her "best friend". I've always believed her love for painting started after she won 1st Prize in the 3rd grade for a painting of a rose in a vase.

Her beautiful long, tapered fingers arranged the most incredible rose petals in oil painting and turned pink Hallmark tissue into tissue roses whose beauty literally made me catch my breath! The tissue paper roses were her last accomplishment, and I went about the corridors of the Cardiology unit at St Mary's, the day we left for home, distributing them to nurses who had so sweetly assisted her the last year of her life.

I pass the huge dining room arrangement of roses each morning and thank God for granting me with a Mother who not only painted roses of remembrance but instilled me with courage to go on to live for Christ every day, or as she reminded me: "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me."

So, whenever you look at the stained glass panes at church please remember the beautiful lady Gladys Dean, whose hands chose those colors.
