Missionary Moment for July

Last month, the middle school youth went on a mission trip with Passport, a youth camp that combines worship, training, and mission opportunities into one very full week of service. While this week makes a great impact in the lives of our teens each year, the ministry of Passport reaches much farther than a one week-long mission camp for teens. As our teens return, Passport is just getting started on the summer schedule including over 30 camps and trips around the country for students beginning in 3rd Grade. Elementary students are taught about

missions through hands-on interactive training in their camp environment at PASSPORT kids. PASSPORT missions and PASSPORT choices are camps for middle and high schoolers that include more opportunities to put training into practice through service. Passport's Mission BASE mission trips take students into large city environments allowing for an immersive experience into the culture and realities of communities such as Birmingham, Atlanta, Memphis, and Washington D.C. Passport also has a global impact through their project, "Watering Malawi", which seeks to provide access to clean water, sanitation, and irrigation systems for rural communities in Malawi. NOTES FROM THE PAST



Glen Allen My Community, Part 3:

The name "Allen's Crossing", was probably noted by the Northern troops for the reason that the residence of Mrs. Benjamin Allen was nearby. The first railroad built in America was in 1828. Eight years later the Richmond, Fredericksburg and Potomac Railroad Corporation commenced to build its road extending from Richmond to Washington and passing through Glen Allen. February 13, 1836 it was completed as far as the South Anna River. It was extended to the North Anna River May 5th; to the Potomac River in December in the same year. Very soon accommodation trains were affording luxurious transportation between Glen Allen and other points along the route.

Our country is not all mountainous. The nearest mountains are 50 miles away, but the elevation is above the climatic level of malaria. The United States Coast Survey shows the railroad track at Glen Allen to be 205 feet higher. It is equidistant between the Blue Ridge Mountains and the sea, and has a most equable, all year round climate.

In 1854 this section was visited by a hail storm and caused unusual damage to crops and property. Again, a very bad windstorm passed over Glen Allen on May 26, 1887. It followed the course of "The Northern" which is a branch of the Chickahominy. The damage from this windstorm was equal to a small tornado and was recorded in Washington.
