NOTES FROM THE PAST

Glen Allen My Community, Part 9:

In 1864 Mr. Cussons married Mrs. Sue Allen, widow of Benjamin Allen, after whose homestead Glen Allen was named.

This Glen Allen homestead was situated just southwest of the station. Between the house and garden there was a two story wood building which was intended for the kitchen. Here (in 1870) Captain Cussons began printing druggist labels. He devoted his time an entire year experimenting and sending specimens and price lists to all parts of the world, and the result was the "International Label Printing Establishment", the largest of its kind in the world. Later his establishment began making calendars and was known as "Cussons, May and Co". The business steadily increased every year ~~giving employment to many people of the~~ community and proved a great success financially.
