NOTES FROM THE PAST

Sermons in Stained Glass – Rev. Dr. Roger Collier

Over the next two months, as we continue to celebrate 150 years, we will discover messages from the eight windows in this beautiful sanctuary. The first, which is positioned next to the organ, is dedicated to the beloved former pastor, Rev. Roy Carner. He was pastor from 1927 to 1942 when he along with other ministers volunteered as chaplain in World War II.

At the center of the window is an open Bible, God's Word. The Bible has been translated into more than 1300 languages. Millions are still sold every year. While many people are bothered by what they don't understand in this Book, like Mark Twain, "I am greatly disturbed by what I do understand." Lead by the Holy Spirit, the message of the Bible is revealed to those who seek the answer.

The inscription in the window comes from the Lord's Prayer. I believe that 150 years ago when Glen Allen Baptist Church began, good members were praying as we pray now for "God's will to be done on earth." Having known Rev. Carner and in 1972 preached in the church where he was pastor, I have great confidence that this was his prayer.

As you look at this window week by week, please think about the words that Paul wrote, "You are a letter from Christ written not with ink but with the spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts." You are the only Bible some people will ever read. What message are you sending?
