## NOTES FROM THE PAST

Memories of the old Forest Lodge, Part 1

The invention of Captain John Cussons' Forest Lodge, situated in the heart of old Glen Allen, served as a resort for weary travelers on their way to Charlottesville. Forest Lodge was a summer retreat, where travelers could rest and take in the fresh, extra healthy air or as they referred to it "take in the airs", (a physical restorative). It must have been for them how we today think of the Outer Banks or Myrtle Beach! Mountain Road was the main thoroughfare to Charlottesville, so Forest Lodge was most convenient as a stopping point. The lodge was quite impressive with a wide expansive porch that meandered about the main floor of the building and several upper floors with balconies. There were also cupolas. In her day, Forest Lodge must have looked a very grand lady to those going by on horseback, those in carriages, or still later those who may have come from town off trolley cars!

At some point during the late 1950's or early 1960's, Forest Lodge came under the ownership of Reynolds Metals and the main floor was converted into offices. There, my dear Mom worked for almost 30 years as a legal secretary. Her boss, a kind hearted, stout true southern gentleman by the name of Mr. Luther Sullivan, was also of Irish descent and had a sentimental heart. I recall Mom telling me of the day she watched from the office window Mr. Sullivan lingering in his car instead of hurrying into the office. She was afraid he was ill, but when he finally opened the door and came in he told her he had been listening to Bobby Goldsboro's' song "Honey", a very sweet song that was, for many, a tear-jerker. Mr. Sullivan was so respectful of my Mom he referred to her as "Miss Gladys" and me, "Miss Debbie". I sometimes got off the school bus there and waited 'til Daddy came by to pick us up. I'd sit patiently in the adjoining office room and do homework or more likely, write a poem or creative piece. The place certainly inspired poetry!
