Boy Scouts

In February of each year Glen Allen Baptist Church celebrates nationally renowned Scout Sunday, to recognize the values and life skills that are taught through Scouting programs of Troop 795. On Scout Sunday, the members and leaders of Troop 795 recognize their accomplishments and extend thanks to their charter organization, Glen Allen Baptist Church for its continued support over their long history.

In 1937 Glen Allen Baptist Church was issued a Charter for Boy Scout Troop 39 with Rev. W. Roy Carner as pastor and C. Howerton Parsons, Sr. as Scout Master. This troop under the sponsorship of the Church continued for 41 years of unbroken service to God and Country.

In 1953 the Scout Lodge was built under the leadership of Walter Heenan, with George H. Moody as deacon chairman of Glen Allen Baptist Church (yes, that George H. Moody, of Moody Middle School fame and the George H. Moody Scholarship name sake), Earl Eckert, and Pastor Elmer Stone West, Jr.

The RF&P Railroad donated materials including a boxcar that was taken apart for lumber, and a door, formerly used on a dining car belonging to the railroad. This same door served as the original main entrance to the Scout Lodge.

In 1964 side rooms were added to the Scout lodge. Boy Scouts that helped with this project included David Stone and his father, Robert Stone, Bruce Eckert and his father Earl Eckert, and Forrest Melton.

Boy Scout Troop 795 was chartered in 1995 and is now led by our own Trey Booker as Scoutmaster.

Wednesday Night Bible Study & Small Groups

On February 1, 8, and 15, we will spend three weeks "Seeing Through the Eyes of Jesus" in an adult study written by the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship (CBF). We will kick off Lent with our Ash Wednesday service on February 22 at 6:30pm. Following that, small groups will begin again on March 1. One group will continue the CBF study and another will do a Lenten study. Chet Smith will lead a large group on prayer.
