We will begin our Lenten journey on February 14 at 6:15pm in the sanctuary with our Ash Wednesday service. This will be an evening of reflecting and examining what it means to take up our cross and follow Jesus to Good Friday and Easter Sunday.

156th Anniversary

On February 23, Glen Allen Baptist Church celebrates the 156th anniversary of our founding in 1868. On this occasion we reflect on the recent loss our previous pastor, Dr. Elmer Stone West, Jr, on November 18, 2023, at 101 years of age. In 1947 Elmer West took his first pastorate here at Glen Allen and was the first occupant of our newly built first parsonage, built across from the Church on a lot purchased from Mrs. E. L. Allen (the



mother of Emmett Allen, Jr) for \$700. A graduate of the University of Richmond and the Colgate-Rochester Divinity School, Dr. West also served 27 months in the Naval Reserve.

In 1949, the Scout Lodge was built. The RF&P Railroad donated materials for the Scout lodge, including a boxcar that was taken apart for lumber; and the front door was a door formerly used on a dining car belonging to the railroad.

At the end of 1951, the membership of the church was 445. The Southern Baptist Foreign Mission Board called Dr. West to be the Secretary of Missionary Personnel in 1953.

The Board of Deaconesses stated, "In a faithful and devoted ministry of five years, the Wests have led the church forward in the work of the Lord with increased membership, with greatly increased gifts to the Lord's work, with a progressive Sunday School and Young Peoples Program and with an everadvancing missionary endeavor." Membership increased twelve percent and yearly tithing increased ninety percent when compared to 1946, which was prior to West's arrival.

As part of our 100th anniversary in February 1968, Dr. Elmer West, led a revival service. In 1997 the Church passed a motion to elect Dr. Elmer West as Pastor Emeritus.


