- Openness. These wonderfully gifted ministers will bring new ideas and new energy. Let us bring a spirit of openness to see what God can teach us through their gifts.
- Encouragement. Seek opportunities to encourage them a card, a text, a kind word after worship, etc.
- Excitement. Finally, let them know how excited we are to welcome them to our church family!

These are just a few ways to help them get started, and I hope they are also things we do throughout their ministry to love and support them as they serve alongside us.

As I write my final newsletter article at GABC, I am filled with gratitude, joy, and the utmost love for the congregation of this church. I think back to when I began and the many "life highlights" that have occurred during this time that you have celebrated and supported me through including marriage and the birth of all 3 of our boys. I am so thankful for the support you have always showed me and especially the parents for entrusting me with their most prized possession over the last 8+ years. Nothing has brought me greater joy than the opportunity to work with your children and witness some of their life highlights such as baptism, graduation, and college acceptances to name a few. I am so proud of each youth that has come through this program and have enjoyed watching many of them already grow into wonderful young adults. Throughout my time at GABC I have had the opportunity to form lifelong friendships. Leaving the ministry at GABC was an extremely bittersweet decision. While I know that I will undoubtedly miss working with the youth and families of the church, it also brings me great joy to spend more time with my own family. My time as Associate Pastor of Youth & Family Ministry has been the longest tenured position I have ever held, and I think this speaks volumes of this church community. Ultimately, I was extremely well supported and I know that you will support the next Youth Pastor during this transition. I am so proud of many of the things we accomplished including growing a group of only 2-3 when I arrived to a steady group of around 25 for the majority of our ministry until COVID hit. We had the opportunity to have a Youth Revival night in which we had over 300 participate with 12 other churches involved. Additionally, we grew our summer mission trips to 2 trips each summer along with a fall retreat each year.

One of the many highlights of my time at GABC was the opportunity I had to serve as the Interim Pastor of this church for 6 months followed by a period of 12 months of serving as Co-Interim Pastor with our Pastor Emeritus, Dr. Roger Collier. During this time, I had the great opportunity to serve this church in a different and more intimate way. I had the chance to celebrate some of the greatest moments of your lives including marriage ceremonies, church membership at GABC, baptism, baby/child dedication, deacon ordination, and many more happy moments. I also was with you during some of the most painful and vulnerable moments of your lives.
