- *Clean cobwebs going up to balcony
- *Circular windows/sills in balcony need cleaning
- *Move white chairs in Welcome Center on East side
- *Put new ceiling panel in Ladies bathroom in basement
- *Powerwash cement next to prayer garden
- *Missing bricks leading to front of building
- *Scrub front door leading to Fellowship Hall
- *Take stuff to dump around shed
- *Clean Pavilion lights
- *Paint the metal benches and tables at the pavilion
- *Remove mimosa bushes/trees behind Scout Lodge
- *Linseed oil the Cross in the Prayer garden
- *Spruce up in the Prayer garden
- *Checking, cleaning or replacing HVAC filters as needed
- *Power wash the sidewalks around the Church buildings
- *Repair brick in walkway on East side of church near Prayer Garden Entrance

Children's Sunday School - We've loved seeing many of our kids back on Sunday mornings downstairs in Sunday School. We meet at 9:15am on the first floor of the education building. Sunday School classes meet from 9:15-10am and Choir meets from 10-10:15. Our kids are having lots of fun learning, singing and playing together.

Here are the lesson emphases for our adult classes in October. We hope you will find something that interests you.

Open Door Class – Room 305 – The emphasis this month is "Giving in the New Testament."

Each week's scripture will be from a different book of the New Testament. *Genesis Class* – Room 311 – This class will be studying the Old Testament books of Jonah and Hosea.

Ruth Fidelis Class (women's class) – Room 312 – Most of the month, they will be studying "Words of Hope" (remembrance, resolve, restoration, renewal), followed by "So Stay Faithful" on October 30. We hope to see you in Sunday School in October!

Wednesday Night Children's Time

We will start having some activities on Wednesdays nights for kids from 6:15-7pm. Each Wednesday our kids will have the opportunity to visit the church library. After the library, we'll come down and have fellowship time together with games, mission videos and free play. Our children love building relationships with their church friends through play.
